

**Immovable:** In 1 Corinthians 15, Paul explains the part of the Gospel that deals with the resurrection. In the first part of the chapter, Paul remind us that Jesus died for our sins, that He was buried, and that He rose to life on the third day.

The middle part of the chapter explains that since Jesus was resurrected from the dead, we too, in Jesus, will be resurrected when He returns. Paul reminds us that through our sin we have death, but through Jesus Christ we are made alive! Jesus has conquered death. Then he encourages us to stop sinning and to not be ignorant of God.

**STAY WITH ME HERE, IT'S GONNA GET REALLY GOOD!**

Your first thought about being resurrected from death might be, “What in the world are we going to look like? Are we going to be all gross and messed up?” Perfectly sensible questions. I bet even the people in Corinth had those questions. So Paul finishes up this chapter assuring everyone that there is an earthly body and a heavenly body, and when we are resurrected, we will have the form of the heavenly body.

Okay, so Paul has brought us to the point where he can hit home one of his main focuses of this chapter. He has given us this information about Christ’s resurrection and our resurrection to tell us this: Jesus Christ gives us victory over the sting of death. The sting of death comes from sin, but we have forgiveness of our sin through Jesus’ death and resurrection! Hence, no fear of death!

**Here is where being “immovable” comes into play. 1 Corinthians 15:58, “So, my dear brothers and sisters, be strong and immovable. Always work enthusiastically for the Lord, for you know that nothing you do for the Lord is ever useless.”**

We have no fear of death because we have victory in Jesus over death. We don’t have to worry about it anymore. Live for God, work to impact the Kingdom of Heaven. Spread the Gospel! Let nothing knock you off the path that God has you on. Don’t let fear, worry, people, influences, or anything take your focus away from the One True God. The road to Jesus is narrow, but God will give you strength to remain. Be immovable! Let no one convince you of anything else.
